A young Belgian-born chemist will address our section on March 30 on one of his research projects. Dr. ALBERT L. HENNE, after coming to this country in 1925, has been at different times: a fellow at Mass. Inst. of Technology, assistant to Thomas Midgley, Jr., research chemist for Frigidaire, in charge of the Midgley Foundation at Ohio State University and, since 1938, associate professor of organic chemistry there and associate supervisor of an American Petroleum Institute Project. His address, "Problems Connected with the Synthesis of Pure Hydrocarbons", is concerned with this last activity.
