After Dr. Milton Harris's excellent lecture last month, for our June meeting we look forward to hearing another outstanding address in the field of high molecular weight substances by a local section member with a distinguished professional record. Mr. Carswell received the B.S. degree in Chemical Engineering from the University of Delaware in 1918 and shortly thereafter joined the National Aniline Co., Marcus Hook, Penna. After four years with this firm, he became associated with Rohm and Hass as a research chemist. In 1924 he became Vice-President of the Bates Chem. Co., Lansdowne, Penna. Mr. Carswell joined the research staff of the Monsanto Chemical Co. in 1926. He became Assistant Director of Development in 1935 and worked with Mr. G. du Bois in development of new processes and products. In 1938 he became a Director of the Shawinigan Resins Corp., and in May, 1939, Director of Research at the Monsanto Plastics Division. In June, 1944, he became Western Executive Representative of the Monsanto Chemical Co. with headquarters in Seattle. He is a member of the Board of Directors of I.F. Laucks. With coworkers, Mr. Carswell is the author of numerous technical articles and about 30 U.S. patents. Mr. Carswell belongs to a number of professional organizations, including the ACS, AIChE, Phi Kappa Phi, Tau Beta Pi, and the Chemists Club of New York. Mr. Carswell will be calling upon a wealth of experience when he addresses us on June 19th.
